- Safety Absence of any abuse


BOUNDARIES

UNHEALTHY & ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIPS

Unhealthy:

- Not communicating
- Disrespectful
- Dishonest

- Pressures the other to cross their boundaries




Abusive:

- Communicates abusively
- Intentionally disregards others feelings
- Extreme jealousy
- Doesn't take responsibility for actions
- Forces sexual activity

SEXUAL VIOLENCE

- Ages 12-34 are the highest risk years for rape and sexual assault
- About 70% of all reported victims are under age 35

How do you get consent? ASK!


"Is this okay?"

 do something



SEXUAL BATTERY

GA Law	Offense	Definition	Punishment
0·C·G·A· §16-6-22·1	Sexual Battery	Physical contact with the intimate body parts of another without consent	Misdemeanor OR Felony: 1-5 Years if victim is <16




ACQUAINTANCE RAPE OR DATE RAPE

When someone you know or someone you are dating forces you to have sex




RAPE

GA Law	Offense	Definition	Punishment
0·C·G·A· §16-6-1	Rape	Carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will	Felony: 25 years to life



CHILD MOLESTATION

GA Law	Offense	Definition	Punishment
0·C·G·A· §16-6-4	Child Molestation	Immoral or indecent act with, or in the presence of any child under 16, with intent to arouse perpetrator or child OR Uses an electronic device to send images of a person engaging in an immoral or indecent act to a child under 16 with intent to arouse perpetrator or child	Felony: 5-20 years (1st offense) 10-30 years (2nd offense) Misdemeanor: if victim is 14-16 and perpetrator is 18 or younger and there is less then 4 years age difference



STATUTORY RAPE

GA Law	Offense	Definition	Punishment
0·C·G·A· §16-6-3	Statutory Rape	Sexual intercourse with a person under the age 16, not his/her spouse	Felony: 1-20 years in prison Misdemeanor: if victim is 14-15, the perpetrator is 18 or younger and there is less than 4 years age difference


