



CONSENT

- What is it?
 - Permission, approval, agree, YES
 - Based on choice
 - Active & ongoing
 - Requires equal power
- How do you get someone's consent?

Rape Law
OCGA 16.6.1

(a) A person commits the offense of rape when he has carnal knowledge of:

(1) A female forcibly and against her will; or

(2) A female who is less than ten years of age.

Carnal knowledge in rape occurs when there is any penetration of the female sex organ by the male sex organ. The fact that the person allegedly raped is the wife of the defendant shall not be a defense to a charge of rape.



- Physical force
- Psychological (mental) force

 - Psychological; many times there are no physical injuries

Aggravated Sodomy Law
OCGA 16.6.2

- a) **A person commits the offense of aggravated sodomy when he or she commits sodomy with force and against the will of the other person** or when he or she commits sodomy with a person who is less than ten years of age. The fact that the person allegedly sodomized is the spouse of the defendant shall not be a defense to a charge of aggravated sodomy.

Rape OCGA 16.6.1	Carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will	25 years to Life in prison
Aggravated Sodomy OCGA 16.6.2	Sodomy with force and against the will of the other person	25 years to Life in prison



Georgia General Assembly
Unannotated Code
Sexual Battery Law
OCGA 16.6.22.1

- a) For the purposes of this Code section, the term 'intimate parts' means the primary genital area, anus, groin, inner thighs, or buttocks of a male or female and the breasts of a female.
- b) A person commits the offense of sexual battery when he or she intentionally makes physical contact with the intimate parts of the body of another person without the consent of that person.**

Sexual Offense	Definition	Punishment
Rape OCGA 16.6.1	Carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will	25 years to Life in prison
Aggravated Sodomy OCGA 16.6.2	Sodomy with force and against the will of the other person	25 years to Life in prison
Sexual Battery OCGA 16.6.22.1	Physical contact with the intimate body parts of another without consent	<1 yr. if adults OR 1-5 years if victim < 16


Sexting & Sextortion

- **What is sexting?** Using a cell phone or other electronic device to distribute or receive ***pictures, videos or messages of a sexually explicit nature***
- **What is sextortion?** When ***cyberbullying*** or ***harassment*** occurs as a result of a sexual image used in ***sexting***



What is the Law?

- Under age 18, it is illegal to have, take or send pictures, videos or messages of a sexual nature
- Manufacturing, Possession or Distribution of Child Pornography



Gore v. State,
119 Ga. 418, 419 (46 SE 671) (1904);
Evans v. State,
67 Ga. App. 631 (21 SE 2d 336) (1942).

A victim whose will is temporarily lost from intoxication, or unconsciousness arising from use of drugs or other cause, or sleep, is unable to consent to sexual activity.

- Verbal force
- Words to pressure or persuade
- Threats



Georgia General Assembly
Unannotated Code
Statutory Rape Law
OCGA 16.6.3

- a) A person commits the offense of statutory rape when he or she engages in sexual intercourse with any person under the age of 16 years and not his or her spouse, provided that no conviction shall be had for this offense on the unsupported testimony of the victim.
- b) A person convicted of the offense of statutory rape shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than 20 years; provided, however, that if the person so convicted is 21 years of age or older, such person shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than ten nor more than 20 years. Any person convicted under this subsection of the offense of statutory rape shall, in addition, be subject to the sentencing and punishment provisions of Code Section 17 10-6.2.
- c) If the victim is at least 14 but less than 16 years of age and the person convicted of statutory rape is 18 years of age or younger and is no more than four years older than the victim, such person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sexual Offense Laws

Sexual Offense	Definition	Punishment
Statutory Rape OCGA 16.6.3	Sexual intercourse with a person under 16, not his or her spouse	Varies by age of perpetrator & age of victim
Child Molestation OCGA 16.6.4	Immoral or indecent act to, with, or in the presence of any child under 16	Varies by age of perpetrator & age of victim
Aggravated Child Molestation OCGA 16.6.4	Child molestation which physically injures the child or involves an act of sodomy	Varies by age of perpetrator & age of victim

How to help a friend

- Listen
- Believe them
- Don't blame or judge them
- Offer to go with them to talk to a trusted adult (counselor, parent, teacher) or call Rape Response
- Don't tell them to forget
- Know that Sexual Assault can happen to anyone
